**ADDENDUM TO THE**

**REPORT ON THE CAMPAIGN IN LATIN AMERICA TO SPREAD THE  
ACTIVITIES OF THE ACADEMY**

In the meantime I have finished writing to the relevant Latin American accounting personalities listed in attachment 01. I have got a good percentage of positive answers in the sense of offering disposition to disseminate the activities of the Academy amongst pupils and colleagues, as well as suggestions to contact determined people or to attend determined events. Many answers are still to come. Among the received answers the four following are perhaps the most interesting ones:

1. Messages from René Mauricio Castro, Rosario University, Colombia

René Mauricio Castro, professor at the Rosario University in Bogotá, Colombia, and Director of the Asociación Interamericana de Contabilidad in Colombia, proposes the celebration of a joint event in Colombia to announce and promote the activities of the Academy. He thinks it would perhaps be possible to associate Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, etc., or ALAFEC (Association of Latin American Faculties of Accounting) to the event (Attachment 03).

What would the Academy think of the possibility to celebrate this joint event?

2. Letter from Carlos Rico Bonilla, National University of Colombia.

Carlos Rico Bonilla, professor at the National University of Colombia, invites me officially on behalf of the Centro de Estudios Interdisciplinarios en Contabilidad (Centre of Interdisciplinary Studies in Accounting) of the Universidad Nacional de Colombia to visit the Faculty of Economic Sciences of his university in order to promote the research on accounting history and to disseminate the activities of The Academy of Accounting History (Attachment 04).

3. Message from Ramon Ramos, University of Santiago de Chile

Ramon Ramos, professor at the University of Santiago de Chile, expresses his intention to manage next year an official invitation from the University to give some lecture on accounting history in order to promote this discipline and disseminate the activities of The Academy (Attachment 05).

4. Message from Nubia Yomara Velandia, editor of *Revista Internacional Legis de Contabilidad & Auditoría*, Colombia

Nubia Yomara Velandia has offered the pages of her journal to publish papers on accounting history and to spread the activities of the Academy. She says that in issue 18 April-June 2004 of the journal appears a short report on The Academy of Accounting Historians. I have profited her offer to send her a recent unpublished paper entitled “La historia de la contabilidad, una disciplina en auge” that is, “Accounting history, a discipline in fashion”, where I speak of The Academy and its important contribution to the promotion of accounting history. Under my name I mention my position in the Academy as chairman of the Board of Trustees.
